

Show Rules

- All entries are free and open to financial members of the Orchid Society of N.S.W. Inc. and its affiliated societies, interstate orchid societies, and Australasian Native Orchid Society affiliated groups.
- Although there will be tight security at the showground, entries are received on the basis that the St Ives Orchid Fair Committee shall not be responsible for any damage, destruction or loss to such exhibits, and the exhibitor shall have no claim whatsoever against the St Ives Orchid Fair Committee its sponsors or any of the societies involved.
- Plants competing for prizes shall have been owned by and in the possession of the exhibitor for the preceding six months.
- All plants, exhibited or for sale, must be healthy and free of pests and diseases. The Show Marshal or the Show Committee may reject any plants for any reason, either vendors' or exhibitors', and request they be removed from the venue. Their decision in this is final.
- All plants and pots must be clean. All tabletop displays must be dressed.
- The Show Marshal or Show Committee reserves the right to reject, remove or rearrange any exhibit. Extra classes may be created at the discretion of the Show Marshal or Show Committee.
- All plants must be correctly and clearly labeled in a prominent position. The exhibitors name on top of the back of the plant name label, and the plant name on the front, for the benefit of the Show Marshal.
- Judging will be in accordance with the rules as set out by the Show Committee in this schedule and/or in accordance with the standards and by-laws of the Orchid Society of N.S.W. Inc. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- An exhibitor, including vendors, shall not remove plants, an exhibit or part thereof before the end of the show, without prior permission of the Show Marshal or Show Committee prior to the show.
- Exhibitors may use ferns and/or foliage plants to embellish displays but such plants are not to be considered for judging except for their decorative effect in displays. No flower or fruit other than orchids or Anthuriums may be used in any display.
- Entries in seedling and species classes MUST be nominated to the Show Marshal before judging starts.
- A seedling shall mean the complete plant grown from seed and flowering for the first time. Plants that have been divided prior to being exhibited are not eligible to be shown as seedlings.
- Plants shall be in position ready for judging at 5:30 pm Thursday 15th August. Exhibitors intending to enter displays in class 1 must inform the Show Marshal no later than Sunday 7th April; and for class 2 by no later than Sunday 4th August.
- The St Ives Orchid Fair Committee reserves the right to photograph, for its own purposes, any exhibit in the show.
- Display positions will be balloted, and for class 1 only must be manned during judging. Exhibitors are to ensure that displays present a neat and tidy appearance from ground level.
- All lighting will be supplied by the St Ives Orchid Fair.**
- If in the opinion of the judges no exhibit in any class warrants a prize, none shall be awarded.
- Staking shall be in accordance with the rules of the O.S.N.S.W. i.e. flowers may be supported in the best possible manner for presentation. This support should be in a manner so as not to be obtrusive and distract from the overall beauty and charm of the plant. With a single flowered genus e.g. Paphiopedilum, Lycaste etc., ties or support shall be no higher than immediately below the ovary. If it is necessary to tie above the bottom flower or top branch, the judges are permitted to penalise or temporarily remove such tie for the purpose of judging.
- Nominations for classes 101 to 102 to be submitted to Murray Corrigan (02) 9913 9935 by 30th July. All exhibits, must feature an orchid as the main subject and be presented suitable for displaying. The Show Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of entries. Exhibits in this class are not to have won a prize previously at the St Ives Orchid Fair. Maximum size of an exhibit 600 x 700 mm.
- Prize giving will be at 2:30 pm Sunday 18th August.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to add classes and vary the rules where warranted.

4. Other fresh flowers may be used in any section but orchids must predominate.
