

## Competition Rules

1. Entries shall be free.  
2. **All plants must be entered with the Show Marshall from 8.00am to 11.30am Friday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2016 and benched with the number attached to the pot or plant and placed in the correct position on the bench. Plants must have a name tag with the plant name in the pot or attached to plant and clearly written.**

**NOTE: the computer system will not be used for this Show.**

3. **The show is open to financial members of all orchid groups. Novice and Junior entries will be judged in Novice and Junior sections only, but may be awarded any special awards.**

4. Any exhibitor can enter several entries into any class.

5. **Exhibitor will have owned all exhibits in competitive sections six months prior to the Show.**

6. **Diseased plants** shall not be exhibited

7. The Show Marshall has the right to remove, reject or rearrange any plant, or move into a new class any plant presented for judging.

### Plants presented for judging

8. Judging will be in accordance with these rules as set out by the Society, and in accordance with the standards of the Orchid Society of N.S.W. Ltd.

9. No award will be given if, in the opinion of the judges, it is not warranted. The Society may give other prizes. The Judges decision shall be final

10. **During Judging** all people not involved in the process, **must move away from the judging area** and not interfere in any way. This rule is a directive from the OSNSW Judging Group

11. **Entries are free and accepted on the basis that the organizers shall take all reasonable care of the exhibits, sales plants and miscellaneous items, in both Display and Sales area, but shall not be responsible for any loss, damage or destruction to such items, and exhibitors shall have no claim against any society or group.**

12. No Exhibit shall be removed before the termination of the show without the permission of the Show Marshall. Show terminates at **3.00pm Sunday 11th September 2016**

13. The Show Marshall reserves the right to add classes and vary the rules where warranted.

New classes must have at least 4 plants and 4 left in the old section.

### PLANT CLASS DEFINITIONS

14. **Australasian Classes** - comprises hybrids from **Australia and Territories, Papua/ New Guinea and New Zealand. Fiji, New Caledonia, Irian Jaya, Solomon Islands and Vanuatu**

15. **Miniature** For our purposes miniature has the following meaning: "an orchid having a flower size not exceeding **12mm (1/2")** and **no more than 150mm (6 inches)**

16. **First Flowering Seedling** This class includes any orchid raised from seed, including hybrids and species. However, **it specifically excludes "Mericlone"** plants ie plants derived from **meristem propagation**. **Classes 1- 2 - 3 are open to ALL growers.**

17. *Wyong Spring Time Orchid Show or Societies reserve the right to photograph, for their own purposes, any exhibit in the display. Photos taken by any group have copyrights and may be used for future advertising.*

**All plants sold by any member must be sold on the members' sale table and a commission of 15% of the value will be deducted from the sale. Members must have also exhibited in the Show.**
